Corrective Services (CS) NSW Teams:

- We are in the process of implementing a new worksite annual renewal process by which annual inspections will be discontinued in favour of a reassessment each time a team visits a site. Should a site fail routine WHS inspection work will be suspended until the issues have been remediated.
- A new team has been added to Tuesday's operating out of the Corrective Services Bankstown office. This is a new office so in order to make it simple we have worked out a rotating routine of sites between the Bankstown, Fairfield and Liverpool LGAs. We now have 10 teams operating per week.
- We are currently on target to remove between 130 and 140 tonne of litter and rubbish in the 17/18 year
